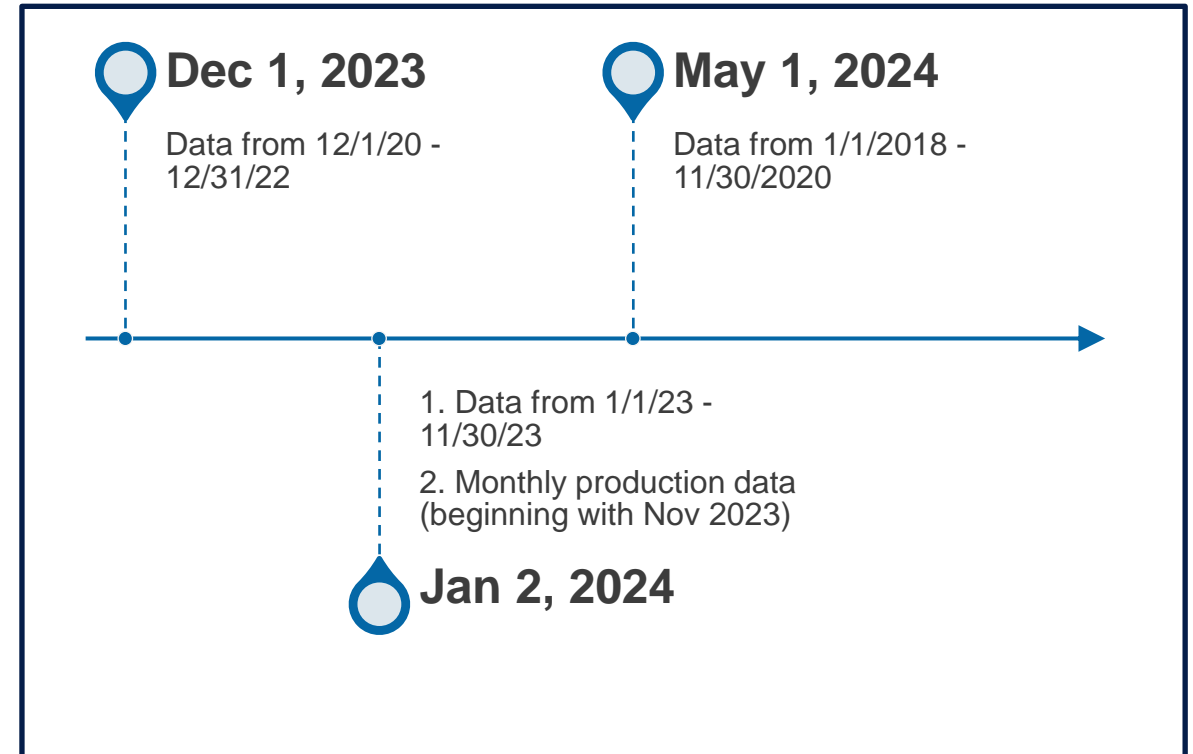

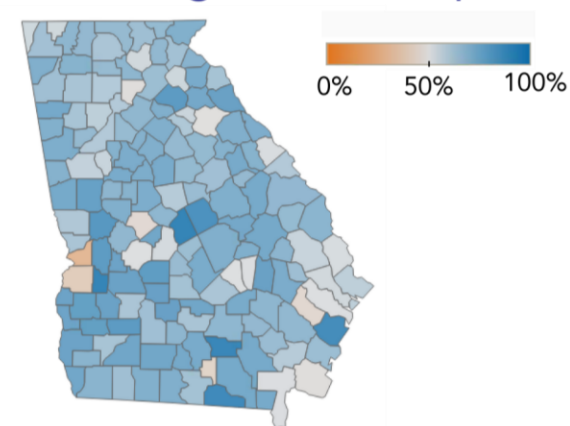

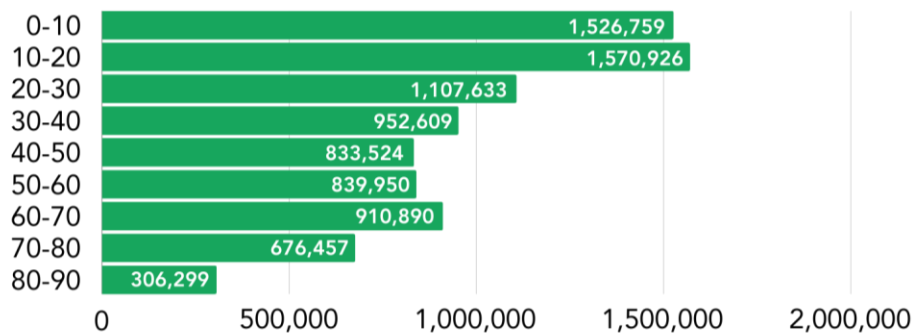

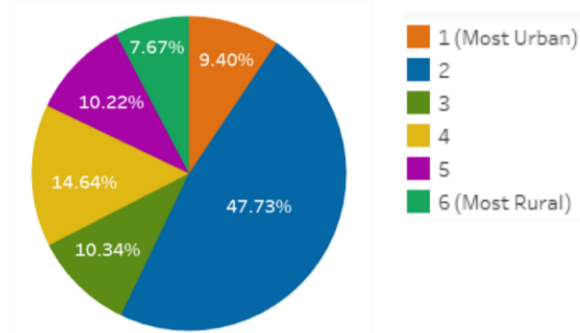
Percentage of GA Population*

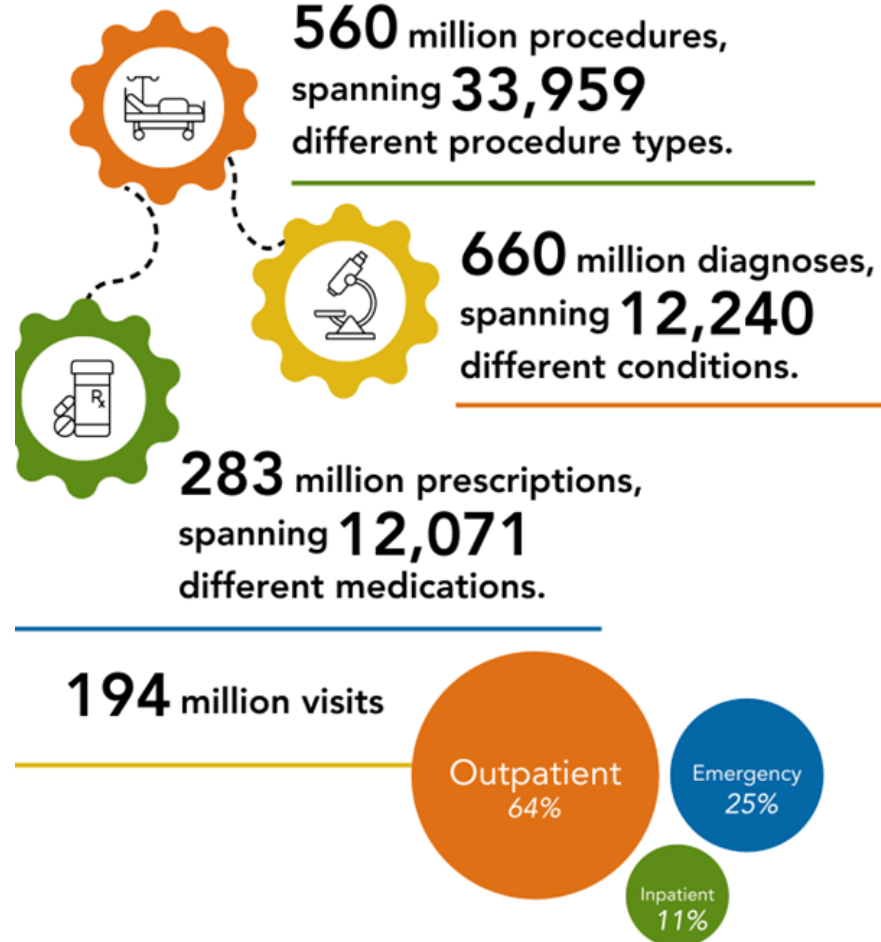

APCD data includes over **53,000** low-back MRIs done in 2022, with prices varying from **\$215** to **\$20,171**.



The cost of a hip replacement in Georgia ranges from **\$1,844** to **\$51,505**.

- The APCD analytics team has developed an efficient cadence working in collaboration with OnPoint and GDAC
- Upon receipt, data are immediately transformed into a standard data model (OMOP) and evaluated through >3,500 quality checks

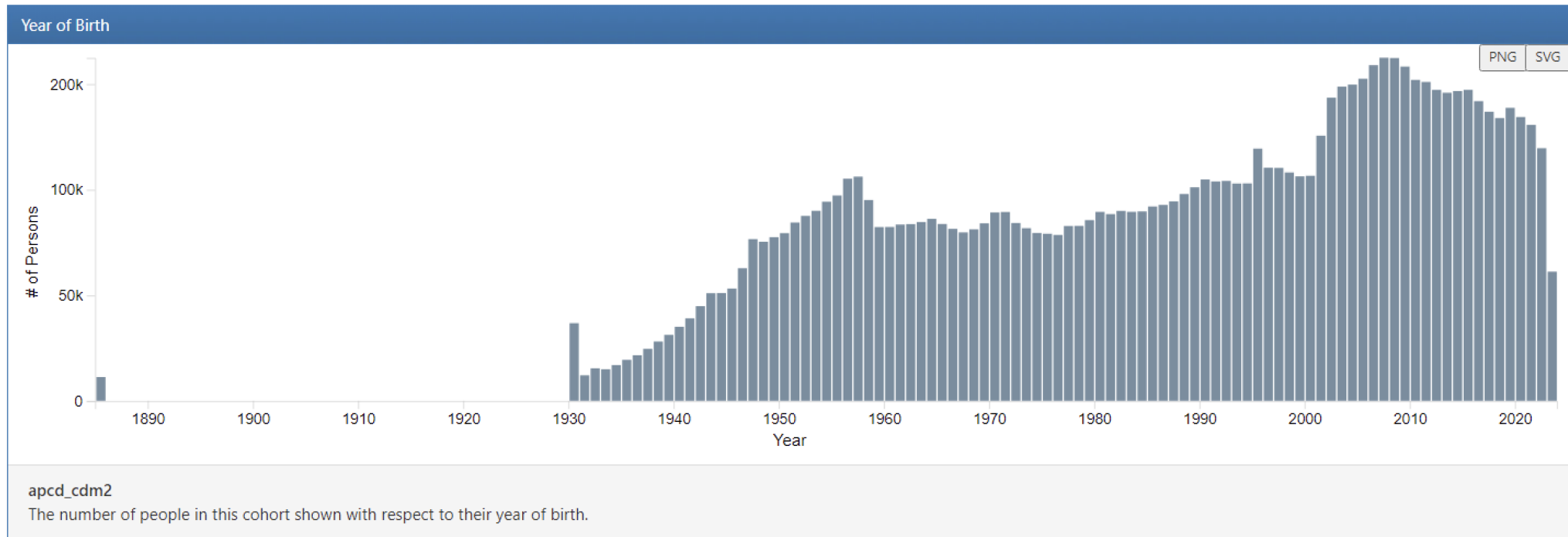

Resources Available with Approved Request

Non-Public Data Extracts

- Include “line-level” information on medical claims
- Include aggregate or “line-level” data involving financially or medically sensitive information
- These data may be provided to approved organizations based on alignment with GA APCD objectives and other criteria following a transparent review process.

Custom Reports

- Custom reports can be generated upon request from organizations based on alignment with GA APCD objectives and other criteria following a transparent review process.
- These reports support entities who may not be able to work with the data directly.

Who is eligible to request non-public data?

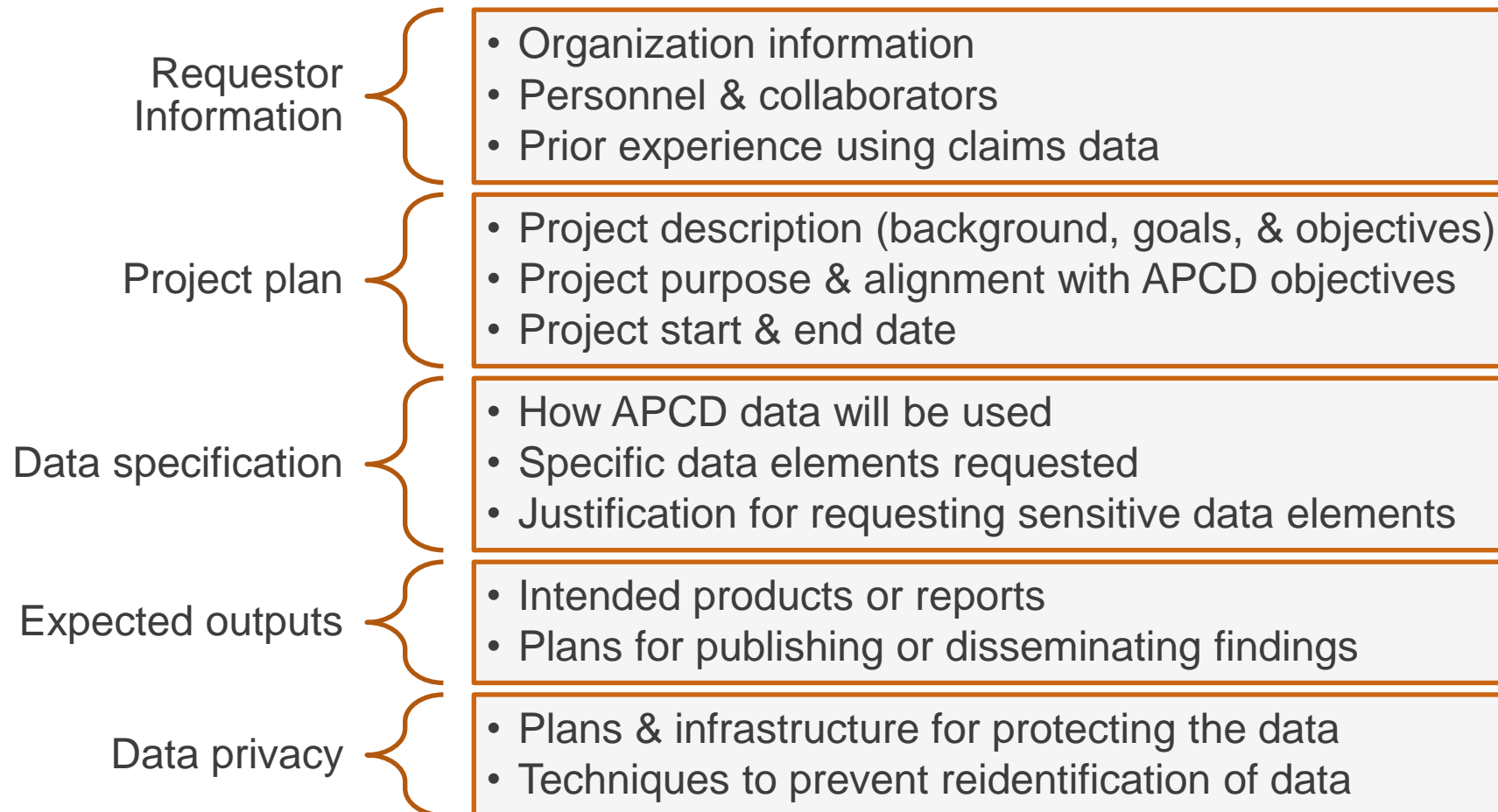
- Types of data requestors
 - Researchers
 - State/Federal entities
 - Payers
 - Providers/Health systems
 - Industry
 - Georgia employers
 - Other
- Additional considerations for data release
 - Organizational affiliation is required to access non-public APCD data.
 - Data may be released to in-state and out-of-state requestors.
 - Fees for data release (schedule TBD) may vary by organizational size and type.

Requirements for Non-Public Data Release

- Describe the project's alignment with Georgia APCD objectives.
- Justify how the data use will benefit the public.
- Demonstrate methodological expertise in claims data analytics.
- Provide documentation regarding security infrastructure.
- All requests should be limited to the minimum data necessary to answer the research question.
- Additional justification will be required for certain data elements to ensure antitrust compliance and to protect sensitive data.

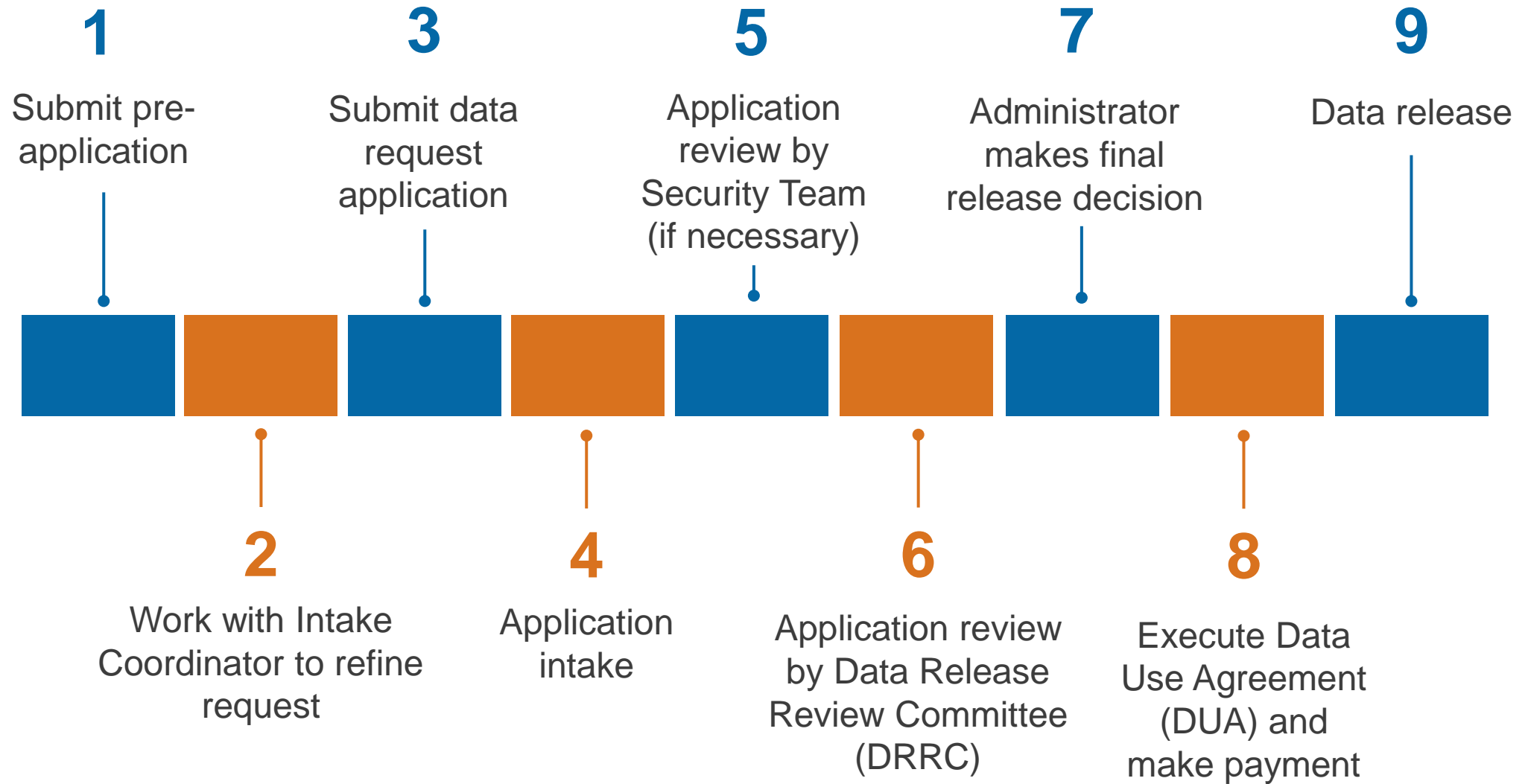
Requestors of non-public data will need to submit an application conveying the following information:



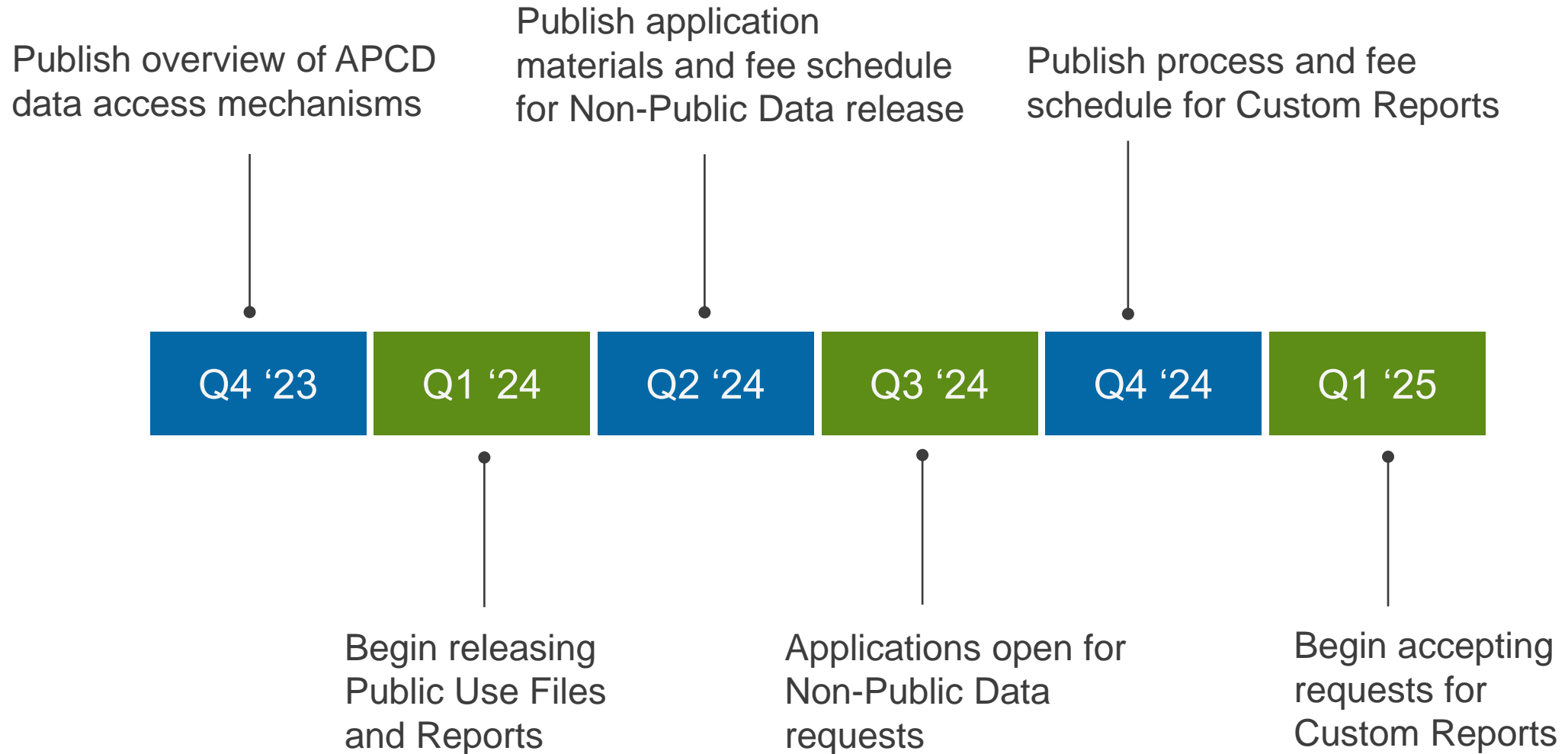
Additional application elements may include:

The submitter rules and data submission guide establish the format, standards, procedures, and deadlines by which health and dental plans must submit data files to the Georgia All-Payer Claims Database.

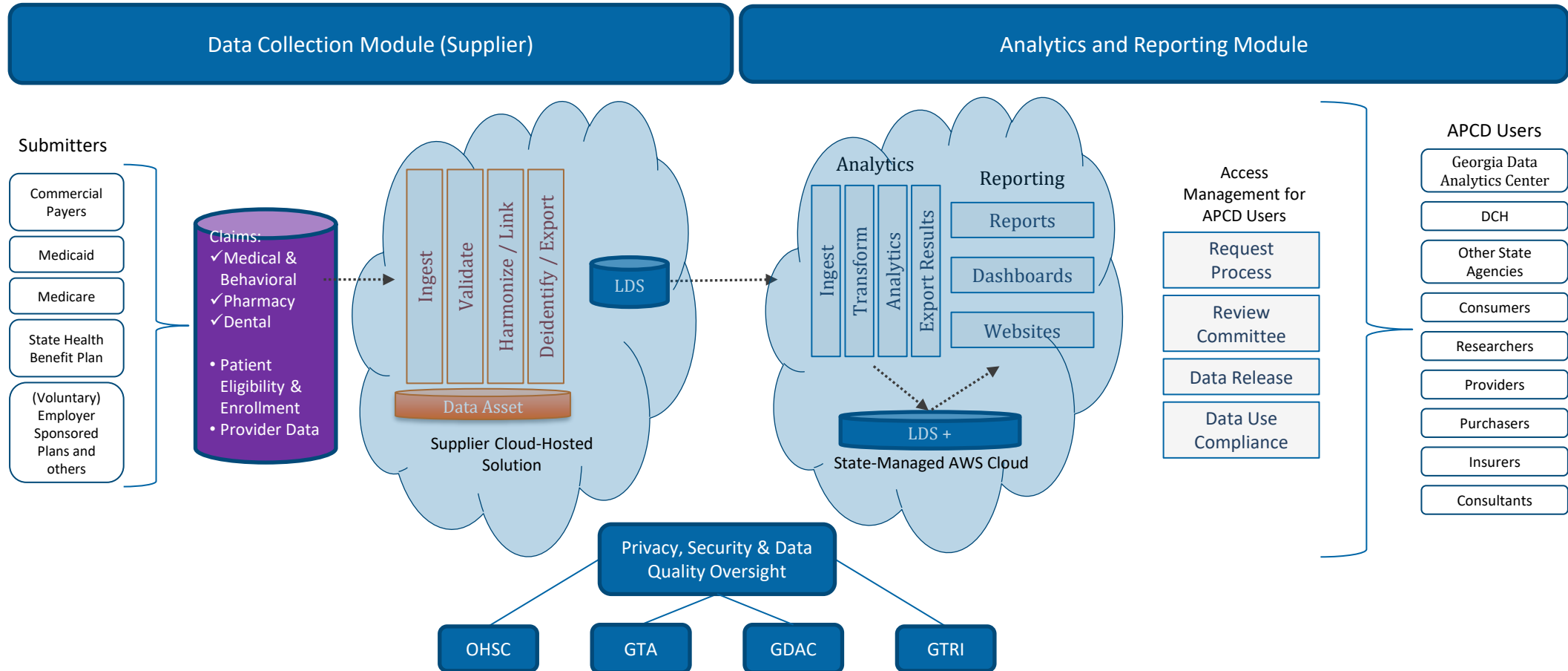
Rules were initially published on December 21, 2022, and became effective on March 3, 2023.

Population	All claims for Georgia residents and their dependents, regardless of where the service was delivered.
Submission frequency	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Monthly submission• All claims adjudicated during the reporting period.
Submission sequencing	No phased onboarding within payer types but provide a path for extensions.
Penalties	\$1,000 per day
Registration deadline	Registration by no later than March 7, 2023
